FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Welcome to March! This spring our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will take what has been known in the past as the ISAT test in April and May. In the January newsletter I talked about the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and how you can help your child at home. In affiliation with the CCSS our testing system will be changing to something called "Smarter Balanced". We will be participating in a computerized trial run in March. This will help students prepare for the tests next year.

Here is some background information on the Smarter Balanced tests:

Smarter Balanced assessments will go beyond previous multiple-choice questions, to include what is called, "extended response" (requiring students to write out their answers). Smarter Balanced tests will include technology enhanced items, as well as performance tasks that allow students to demonstrate critical-thinking and problem-solvina Performance tasks challenge students to apply their knowledge and skills to respond to complex realworld problems. They can best be described as collections of questions and activities that are connected to a single theme or scenario. These activities are meant to measure things such as depth of understanding, writing and research skills, and complex analysis, which cannot be adequately assessed with traditional multiple choice test questions. The performance tasks will be taken on a computer and will take one to two class periods to complete.

I will provide more information as time draws closer to our piloting of the new test. If you would like more information, feel free to check out www.smarterbalanced.org. This will give you a look at Smarter Balanced sample items and performance tasks, and give you a better understanding of what the new types of questions students will encounter are.

Parent teacher conferences are scheduled for the evenings of March 18 & 19. You will receive an appointment time from the school office. Please let us know right away if you have a conflict so we can reschedule your conference time. It is quite a process to get all parents scheduled, so your help is greatly appreciated. Teachers are looking forward to sharing your child's growth with you, so be sure to attend! Thanks for being our partner in your child's education.

EXTENDED SCHOOL DAY ENDS

As of March 20, 2014 our extended school day ends for all grades. School will dismiss at 3:35 p.m. instead of 4:00 p.m. Buses home will run approximately 20 minutes earlier then they do now. We are sending you this information early so you will have time to make arrangements for daycare if needed.

The purpose of our extended school day was to prepare students for state testing that begins after spring break, March 24-27.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Shoshone School District Kindergarten Registration for the 2014-2015 school years will be held in our kindergarten classrooms on Thursday, April 17, from 5:30-8:00 P.M. Please bring your child with you when registering him/her for kindergarten. Registration and screening will take approximately 45 minutes.

In order to register your child for kindergarten he/she must turn 5 on or before September 1, 2014 (no exceptions). To complete registration, parents must provide the child's official state birth certificate and completed immunization record. *Children must be current on their immunizations to register.*

If you do not have an official birth certificate and your child was born in Idaho, you may obtain one from Idaho Vital Statistics, P.O. Box 83720, Boise, Idaho 83720-0036 (208-334-5988) or by going online at www.healthandwelfare.idaho.gov.

If your child was born in another state, we have addresses for each of the states. Please call the school elementary office at 886-2381 ext. 138 for information. Please remember that we need the official birth certificate, not a hospital certificate.

PRE-SCHOOL CHILD FIND

We will be holding a pre-school eligibility screening on Thursday, April 17, 5:00-8:00 p.m. The purpose of this screening is to help us identify resident preschool children delayed in learning. This delay could be due social skills, self care needs, development, gross/fine motor skills or in speech and language. This service is available to all resident, 3-5 year old children. To be eligible for testing your child must turn 3 before April 17, 2014. If you have developmental concerns about your preschool child please call our elementary office at 886-2381 ext. 138 so we can schedule a screening appointment for your child.
